There will be the usual Thursday morning communions at St Margaret's, starting at 10.00.

<u>Please note</u>: The Walsingham Cell Mass, on Wednesday 9th September, has been cancelled, given a number of absences.

Please be reminded that face coverings are required in Places of Worship, unless you have a health reason for not wearing one, and we do need to continue to practice social distancing and hygiene and keeping a record of who has attended.

There has been a change in the <u>guidance about singing</u>. Whilst congregations are not permitted to sing (on health grounds, rather than musical ability!), singing is permitted for small groups of performers in a physically distanced and safe way. Deputy wardens and the associated leads will be discussing this and seeing how we can take this forward.

Farewell to Anne Yarrow

The 9.00 service at St Mark's on 30th August will be Anne Yarrow's last service in Hadlow Down after four decades with us. She and Chris are moving to Lewes (so not that far away) and they leave with all our thanks and best wishes.

In light of her service to the church and village we have agreed to add in an "extra" service for her, and Fr David Milnes has agreed to squeeze in an extra service in his schedule.
