News from the Parish - 9th August 2020

Today's gospel (Matthew 15; (10-20) 21-28) has an optional extra piece to read (verses 10-20) and within this (verse 15) Peter asks Jesus to explain a parable to them. Jesus' response is "Are you still so dull?" (the King James' version is slightly politer: "Are ye also yet without understanding?", whilst another translation has: "Don't any of you know by now what I am talking about?"). You sense a degree of frustration in his response.

Once again it seems that poor Peter is the stooge to allow Jesus to explain the parable (you'll have to read it to get the explanation). Mind you, I know that a number of my school teachers would have made much the same comment about me!

It can, for us, seem incredible that the disciples were so slow on the uptake. They were there at the time, seeing the miracles, hearing the parables and receiving the teaching – directly from Jesus – and yet they still struggled to fully understand.

In a strange way this is comforting, for when we may have doubts, for we are not alone. Thomas will forever be known as "Doubting" Thomas and, at one time or another, all the disciples had their doubts and uncertainties.

What is encouraging is that, millennia later, whilst we may still have doubts, the teachings of Jesus still continue, as does our faith.
